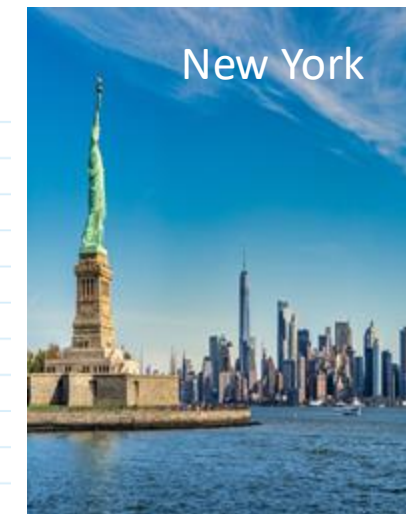
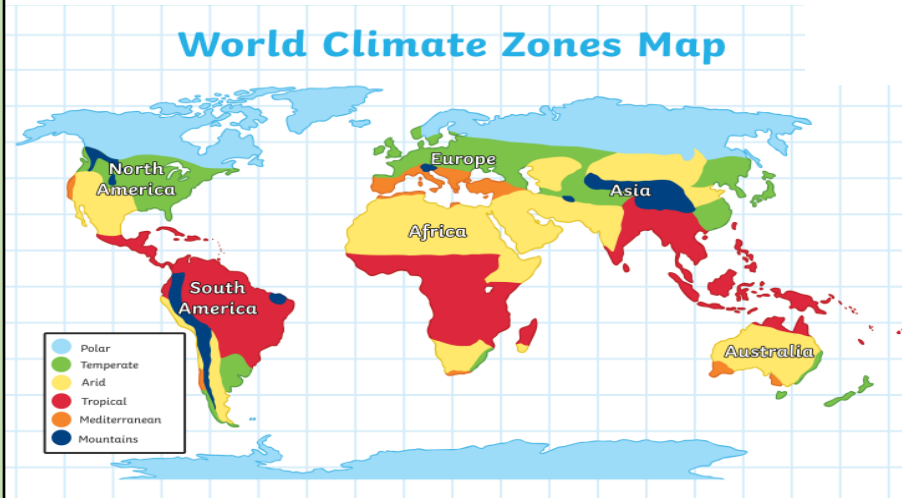

Key Vocabulary

Continent	A continent is a large landmass on Earth and there are A location is the particular position of something on Earth. Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Europe, North America, South America, Oceania
Location	A location is the particular position of something on Earth.
Equator	The Equator is an imaginary line encircling Earth at 0° latitude and is an equal distance from the North Pole and the South Pole.
Northern Hemisphere	The northern hemisphere is the half of Earth located north of the Equator.
Southern Hemisphere	The southern hemisphere is the half of Earth located south of the Equator.
Weather	The weather of a place is the day to day condition of the atmosphere, e.g. sunny, snowing, warm, etc.
Climate	Climate describes the average weather conditions over a long period of time.
latitude	Lines of latitude are imaginary lines on Earth showing positions north or south of the Equator, measured in degrees.
Physical geographical feature	A physical geographical feature is natural and has not been built by humans.
Landscape	A landscape is an area and its landforms and features that can be seen when viewed from another place.
Biome	Biomes are regions of the world with places that have similar climates, vegetation and animals that have adapted to living there.
Settlement	A settlement is a place where groups of people live and work.
Population	The population is the total number of people living in a particular area.
Major City	A major city is a large city with a population of over 100,000 and may be the largest city in the county.
Landmark	A feature in the landscape which has a particular meaning attached to it, for example to help with directions, is called a landmark .
Locality	A locality is the small area around the particular position of something on Earth.
Goods and services	Goods are physical items that people need or buy, for example food or clothes. Services are systems that supply a public need, for example waste collection.
Wealth	Wealth is having a lot of money, possessions or resources.
inequality	Inequality is when something is not shared evenly between everyone.
Indicator	An indicator is a sign that shows the level or state of something.
