#### **Reporting Absence**

If your child is too unwell to attend school, please contact school by phone or email before 9.10am and inform us of the reason for their absence and when you expect them to return to school. If telephoning please leave a message if no-one answers as it is not always possible for someone to answer the phone. Thank you.

#### Holidays during term time – a reminder

New guidance is in place regarding holidays taken in term time. Holidays are in no circumstances authorised by this school. Unauthorised absence due to holidays will result in a fine being issued, this is the case from one day of absence.

**I'll go on holiday and pay the fine** – Education Penalty Notices have now been capped nationally at **two fines** within any three-year period. After this, other action like a parenting order or prosecution has to be considered and this could mean a fine of up to £2500.

What is an unauthorised absence – A child being kept off school unnecessarily or without good reason. Term time holiday is not a justified reason to take your child out of school.

In the May 2024 newsletter we gave prior warning that from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024 any unauthorised holidays (for 1 day or longer) will be passed on to Derbyshire County Council and a fine may be issued.

There is a form that MUST be completed prior to children being absent from school during term time for a holiday. These must be completed at least two weeks before the holiday and should be completed before the holiday is booked so that you know before you book whether or not the holiday will be approved. Parents who take their children on holiday without permission will incur an unauthorised absence for their child.

#### Break Time Snacks and Packed Lunches

Here is a reminder of our guidelines for break time snacks and packed lunches.

#### Snacking

Both schools understand that snacks can be an important part of the diet of young people and can contribute positively towards a balanced diet. The school discourages the consumption of snacks high in fat and sugar at break-time. Pupils in the Garden Class (YR, Y1, Y2) are provided with a piece of free fruit every day and pupils in the Meadow Class (Y3, Y4, Y5, Y6) may bring in a piece of fruit or other healthy snack.

#### Packed Lunches

The school encourages parents and carers to provide children with packed lunches that are healthy.

#### School Improvement Plan

Each year we choose three or four areas that we will work on to improve provision for all our children. So that parents are aware of what we are doing I will now incldue an update on one of these areas in our newsletter.

This academic year one of the areas we are developing is our chidlren's knowledge and understanding of world faiths. Our starting point for this was to ensure children could link a religion to the name of worshippers, the symbol for the religion, the place of worship and the holy book. We did this by including this in Collective Worship / Assemblys. For example Judaism, -

The mojority of our children can now confidently do this for Christianity, Judaism, Hinduism, Buddism, Sikhism and Islam.

Our whole Partnership trip to the Open Center in Derby will support this learning and children will visit some of these places of worship, therefore bringing this to life.

In our Religious Education lessons children learn different things about each religion and previous learning is built on to support children's knowledge and understanding.

#### Partnership – Events in Spring 2025





The children enjoyed a fun morning of Sports Hall Athletics at the Rural Derbyshire School Sport Partnership event.

They took part in a Thai Chi session as well as practicing their balancing skills and enjoying a range of games.

#### DT Day 1 and 2 - 13/02/25 and 14/02/25

The children worked across both schools to create their DT projects. **EYFS:** Our EYFS DT days were themed around the story Dear Zoo through which we explored animal focussed activities. These included making banana milkshakes (for the monkeys), developing our scissor control making curly snakes, making a simple lift the flap book, constructing paper chain snakes, sorting and grouping animals according to their habitats and identifying differences between animal skins.





Year 1 and 2: Years 1 and 2 learnt about levers and sliders which they then used to design and create their own moving pictures linked to the story of 'The 3 Little Pigs'. The children really embraced this unit of work and created some amazing moving pictures.



#### Year 3 and 4:

Year 3/4 designed and created a Jack-in-the Box in pairs using the woodworking skills they learned over the two days, measuring, sawing and hammering in nails to create the box. They used pneumatics to make the pop-up mechanism. Mr Lovett was very impressed with the woodworking skills the children showed in creating the box and the sensible way in which they used the tools involved.



#### Year 5 and 6:

Years 5 and 6 enjoyed two DT days where they designed and created a moving toy using cams to move the toy. They called on their previously learned woodworking skills to cut and assemble the toy.
