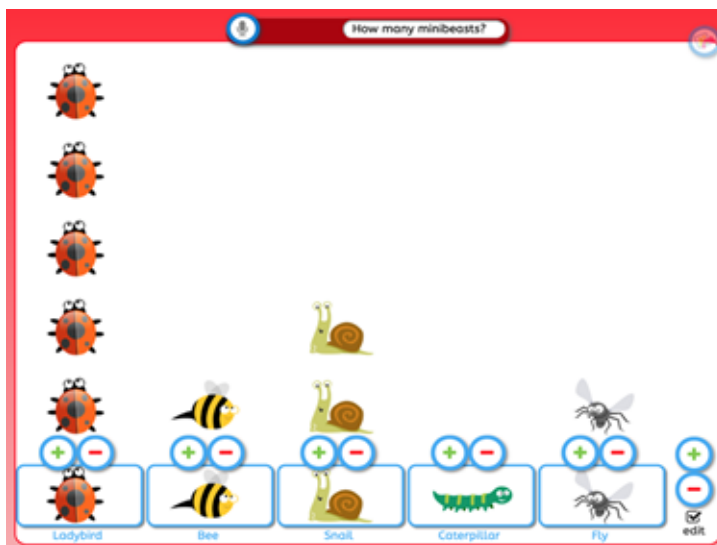

Key Vocabulary

Tally chart	A way of counting by drawing lines or marks to keep track.
Data	Information we collect, like numbers or facts.
Total	The whole amount when we add things up.
Pictogram	A chart that uses pictures to show numbers.
Enter	To put in something, like writing numbers or typing on a computer.
Most common	The thing that happens the most or has the biggest number.
Least common	The thing that happens the least or has the smallest number.
Attribute	A special feature about something, like colour, size, or shape.
Same	When two things are alike.
Different	When two things are not alike.
Block diagram	A chart that uses blocks or rectangles to show numbers.
Sharing	Splitting things fairly between people.
