A long time ago, Jesus rode into a place called Jerusalem on a donkey. People were very happy and waved palm leaves. This day is called **Palm Sunday**.

Later in the week, something very sad happened. Jesus died on a day called **Good Friday**. Christians remember this day and feel very sad.

But the story does not end there! On **Easter Sunday**, something amazing happened – Jesus came back to life! Christians believe this shows that Jesus brings new life and hope. They feel very happy on this day.

People celebrate Easter in different ways. Some go to church and pray, while others give Easter eggs and talk about the Easter Bunny. The eggs are special because they remind Christians of the new life Jesus brings.

Easter is a time of happiness, hope, and new beginnings!



Key Vocabulary	Definition
God	the all loving and powerful being that Christians believe created the world and everything in it
Salvation	being saved or rescued so that humans are no longer separated from God
Saviour	Jesus came to save or rescue people e.g., by showing them how to live
Resurrection	Jesus' return to life after dying
Eternal Life	the belief that through Jesus' death Christians can go to Heaven to be with God for eternity.
Secular	anything that is not connected with religion or religious worldviews
Easter	the Christian festival which remembers the resurrection of Jesus.
Worship	to praise and follow God
Good Friday	the Friday of Holy Week, the day on which Jesus was crucified.
Religious	believing in a religion
