Florence Nightingale

- Florence was born in Italy
- She trained as a nurse
- She helped improve hospitals which were very dirty and unhygienic
- She became known as the lady with the lamp as she looked after soldiers in the night.
- She met Queen Victoria

Mary Seacole

- Mary was born in Jamaica
- Her mother was a nurse and she helped her look after the sick
- She wanted to join Florence
 Nightingale but wasn't allowed
- She opened a British hotel where the soldiers could rest
- She became known as Mother Seacole as she risked her life on the battle field to nurse soldiers from both sides


