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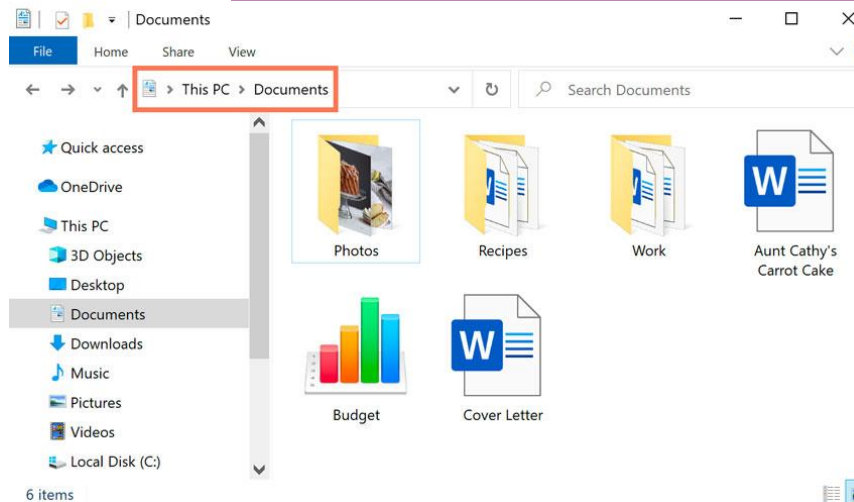
Technology Around us

Key Vocabulary

Technology	Tools and machines we use to make our lives easier, like computers, phones, and tvs
Online	Using the internet, like when you play games, watch videos, or talk to friends on a computer or phone
Logging in	Using a password to get inside and use the computer or website
Mouse	A mouse is a small tool you move with your hand to point and click on things on the computer screen. It usually has buttons to press.
Drag	Drag means to hold down a button on the mouse while moving it to move things around on the computer screen
Click	Clicking is when you press a button on the mouse to select or open something on the computer screen
Keyboard	A set of buttons with letters and numbers that you press to type words and numbers on the computer
Typing	Pressing the keys on the keyboard to write words and numbers on the computer screen
File	A folder where you can keep your pictures, documents, or games on the computer.
Deleting	Deleting means removing something, like a picture or a document, from the computer so it's not there anymore.
Cursor	A little arrow or blinking line on the computer screen that shows you where you are pointing or where you will type next.
