Knowledge – What I will be learning

- The Hindu tradition is diverse and ever changing and according to the 2021 Census, 1.7% of the population of the UK are Hindus.
- The ultimate reality is known as **Brahman** who is the source of everything in the universe.
- The **atman** is a spark of Brahman in every living creature and the **namaste** welcome is a way of recognising the spark of Brahman inside every living creature.
- The **Aum** symbol represents Brahman but also the first sound in the creation of the universe.
- Brahman** can be found in many different forms, known as **deities**. For many Hindus the three most important deities are known as the **Trimurti**. **Brahma** is the **creator** deity who is responsible for the creation of the universe. **Vishnu** is the **preserver** deity who maintains the universe and **Shiva** is the **destroyer** deity so that new things can begin in the cycle of life and death.
- Another important deity for Hindus is **Lakshmi**, at Diwali many Hindus will put statues of Lakshmi outside their homes in the hope that she will visit the home and bring the family good fortune for the new year

Definition



Hindu - A person who follows Hinduism, a religion with many gods and spiritual teachings.

Brahman - The supreme, unchanging reality in Hinduism, believed to be the source of everything.

Deity - A god or goddess in a religion.

Namaste - A traditional greeting in Hinduism, meaning "I bow to the divine in you." It's a gesture of respect.

Shiva - A major god in Hinduism, known as the destroyer and transformer in the universe.

Aum - A sacred sound and symbol in Hinduism, representing the universe and the ultimate reality.

Atman - The soul or individual self in Hinduism, believed to be a part of Brahman.

Lakshmi - The goddess of wealth, prosperity, and good fortune in Hinduism. **Vishnu** - A major god in Hinduism, known as the protector and preserver of the universe.

Brahma - The god of creation in Hinduism, one of the Trimurti (three main gods: Brahma, Vishnu, and Shiva).
