Environment	The world around us, including nature, air, water, and land.
Waste	Things that are thrown away or not used properly.
helper	Someone who gives support or does things to help others.
responsible	When you do what you are supposed to do and take care of things properly.
safe	Being protected from harm or danger.
healthy	When your body and mind are strong and well.
influence	When something or someone changes the way you think or act.
opinion	What you think or feel about something.
respectful	Being kind and polite to others.
courteous	Another word for being polite and using good manners
voluntary group	A group of people who work together to help others without being paid.
community group	group of people who live in the same area and work together to make it better.
pressure (action) group	A group of people who try to make changes in the world by asking the government or businesses to do something.

	The amount of money needed to buy or do something.

wages	Money paid to workers, usually every week, for the work they do
salaries	A set amount of money paid to workers, usually every month, for their job.
rent	Money paid to use a house, flat, or land that belongs to someone else
Fair Trade	A way of buying and selling things where farmers and workers are paid fairly for their work.
proposal	A plan or idea that is suggested for others to think about.
debate	A discussion where people share different opinions about a topic.
amendments	Changes or improvements made to a plan, law, or document.
penalties	Punishments or consequences for breaking a rule or law.
enforcement	Making sure that rules or laws are followed.
majority	More than half of a group agreeing on something.
House of Commons	A part of the UK Parliament where elected Members of Parliament (MPs) discuss and make laws.
House of Lords	A part of the UK Parliament where experienced and important people review and suggest changes to laws.
Royal Assent	The final approval from the King or Queen to make a law official.
