Adoption	When an adult legally becomes a child's parent and cares for them.
Fostering	When an adult looks after a child who cannot live with their own family for a time
Same sex couple	Two adults of the same gender who love and care for each other.
Blended family	Two adults of the same gender who love and care for each other.
community	A family made up of adults and children from previous families coming together.

Biological sex	Whether someone is born male, female, or both.
Sexual orientation	Who someone loves or likes.

Gender expression	How someone shows their gender through clothes or behaviour.
Verbal abuse	Using mean or hurtful words.
