



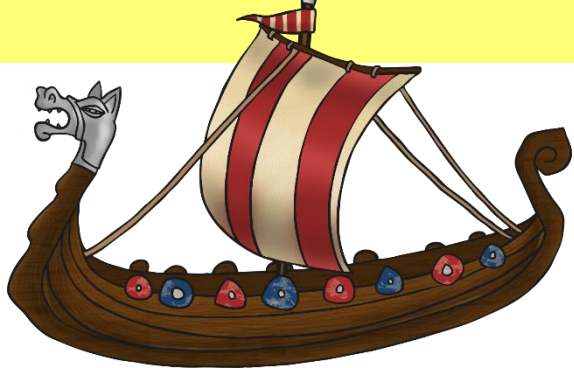

Vikings and Anglo Saxons

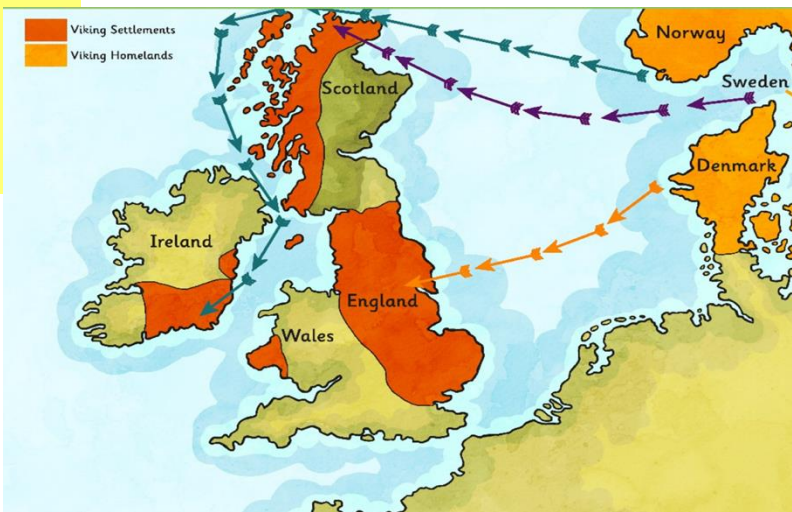
Sticky learning

Viking	People from Norway, Denmark and Sweden who lived over 1,000 years ago. They were farmers, traders, and sometimes fierce warriors.
Raid	A quick attack where Vikings would suddenly arrive, steal treasure, and sometimes burn villages.
Invasion	When an army enters another country to take over and rule it.
1066	A very important year in history when the Battle of Hastings happened and William the Conqueror became king of England.
Longships	Special Viking ships that were long, fast, and could sail in the sea or up rivers.
Alfred the Great	A king of England who fought the Vikings and made his kingdom stronger.
Athelstan	The first king to rule over all of England as one country.
Danegeld	A type of tax (money) paid to the Vikings to stop them from attacking.
Odin	The main god in Viking stories, believed to be very wise and powerful.
Longhouse	A big wooden house where Viking families and their animals lived together.
Runes	The letters in the Viking alphabet, carved into wood, stone, or metal.
Laws	Rules made to help people live fairly and safely together.
Justice	Making sure that people are treated fairly when they break the law or when something is wrong.
Battle of Hastings	A famous battle in 1066 where William the Conqueror defeated Harold II to become king of England.
Normans	People from Normandy in France who came to England in 1066 with William the Conqueror.
Edward the Confessor	A king of England before 1066, who died without children, which led to a fight over who should be king.
Harold II	The last Anglo-Saxon king of England who lost the Battle of Hastings.
William the Conqueror	The Duke of Normandy who won the Battle of Hastings and became King of England in 1066
