Key Vocabulary	Definition
prejudice	A person is prejudiced when s/he has formed an attitude towards a particular social group of people before having enough information on which to form a knowledgeable opinion.
disability	When someone has a part of their body or mind that works differently and might make certain things harder for them to do.
gender	Whether someone is a boy, a girl, both, or neither.
race	A way to describe groups of people who have similar physical features, like skin color, hair type, or facial features, and often come from similar parts of the world.
colour	Different people have different skin colour
sexuality	Who someone loves or likes in a special way.
similarities	The ways that things or people are alike or have things in common
differences	The ways that things or people are not the same
respect	Treating others kindly and thinking about their feelings
stereotype	A simple idea that says all people in a group are the same, even though they're not
Sex	Refers to the biological differences between boys and girls

Key Vocabulary	Definition
sexual orientation	Who someone feels a special attraction or love for
gender identify	How someone feels inside about being a boy, a girl, both, or neither.
gender expression	How someone shows their gender to the world through things like their clothing, hairstyle, behaviour, and interests.
relationships	The connections and bonds we have with other people.
friend	Someone you like to spend time with, who makes you feel happy and safe.
acquaintance	Someone you know, but not very well.
unique	Being one of a kind or special in your own way
identity	Who you are and what makes you, <i>you</i>
prejudice	Having a negative opinion or judgment about someone or a group of people without really knowing them.
respect	Treating others the way you want to be treated
diversity	Having a variety of different people, cultures, and ideas in one place
tolerance	Being accepting and respectful of people who are different from you.
