Family	-The people who love you and care for you.
Look after	- To take care of someone or something.
Help each other	- To be kind and help one another.
Be alone	- To be by yourself.
Working together	- Doing something as a team.
Responsibility	- Doing what you should do and taking care of things.
Helpful	- Being kind by helping others.
Caring	- Being kind and looking after others.
Behaviour	- The way you act.
Consequences	- What happens because of what you do.
Special person	- Someone who is important to you and makes you feel loved and safe.
Promise	- Saying you will do something and meaning it.

Word	Definition
Environment	- The world around us, including the air, land, water, plants and animals.
Safe	- Not in danger.
Unsafe	- Not safe. It could hurt you.
Uniform	- Special clothes people wear to show where they belong, like at school.
Ask for help	- To tell someone you need help.
Help	- Being kind by doing something for someone.
Share	- Letting others have some or join in.
Take turns	- Waiting for your go and letting others have theirs.
Listen	- Paying attention when someone is talking.
