

Homework Agreement

Meadow Class

### Homework

Homework will be issued on a **Friday** and is expected to be completed by the following **Thursday**. It is then marked prior to issuing the next week's homework. This gives children 6 days to complete the work and means that families can choose a time to fit in with their weekly routine. Homework is expected to be completed <u>neatly</u> in the Homework book, <u>to the same standards expected for work completed in school</u>. If homework is not completed by Friday, children may be asked to complete work at break or lunchtime that day. If a child is absent on the day that homework is issued, the work will be issued to them on their return. If you have any questions about homework, please ask Mrs McManus or Mrs Price as soon as possible.

# **English**

### Reading

Children are issued with a school reading book and are expected to read regularly at home. For those children reading from the Reading Scheme, this should be daily, usually with an adult. For more confident readers and those on the "Free Readers", this should be 4 times weekly (at least once a week with an adult), to develop comprehension and inference skills. Please use the Reading Record to write comments. Children will earn Do-Jos for reading signed by an adult and they will move up their classroom reading ladder.

## **Spellings**

Children have their own personal lists of the Statutory Spellings for their year group to practise at home. There is no weekly spelling test, however, we believe that regular practice will help the children to improve the spellings in their daily written work. Please practise no more than 5 spellings each week.

See the document "Practising Spellings at Home" on the English Phonics and Spellings page of the Long Lane website for ideas of strategies you could use with your child at home. We are also using these strategies at school.

### Writing

Some homework will include an opportunity to consolidate the work done in class by producing a piece of writing, e.g. a diary or piece of research. This work is expected to be presented to the same standards as work at school.

## <u>Grammar</u>

Homework may include practising grammar or punctuation, e.g. writing sentences with an adjective. Examples will always be given. Please ask if anything is unclear.

## Mathematics

Mathematics homework will be issued throughout the term, alternating with English homework and topic work.

In addition, it is important that the children regularly practise their times tables, e.g. by using an app or a website such as Hit The Button or TT Rockstars, by asking "quick-fire" questions or by chanting the tables. The national expectation is that children will know all their times tables by the end of Year 4 ready for the statutory multiplication test. In Years 5 and 6 we work on quicker recall of multiplication and division facts, also on "using what you know", e.g. if  $3 \times 2 = 6$ , then  $300 \times 2 = 600$ .

# Optional Homework

Children are always encouraged to carry out research or bring in information, books or artefacts related to the current topic! Although we don't have a regular slot for Show and Tell, children are welcome to show or tell the class any relevant information that they have found out in their own time!
