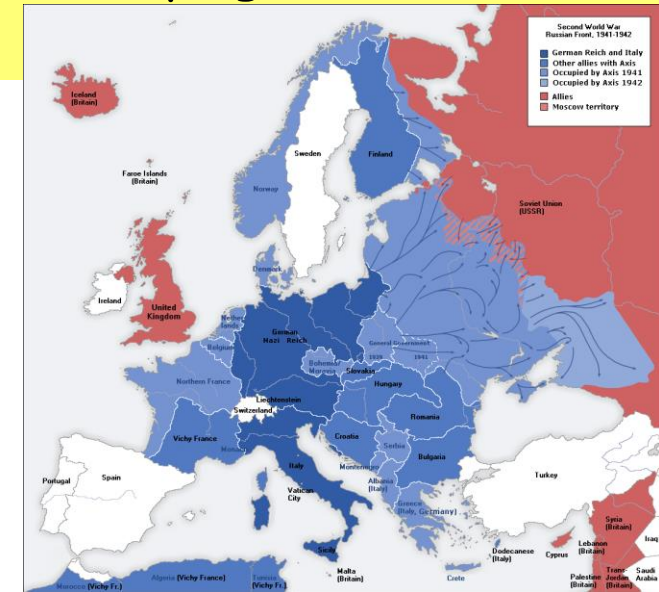

Second World War	A war that happened from 1939 to 1945 where many countries fought each other.
Allies:	The group of countries, like Britain, the USA, and others, that worked together during the Second World War.
Adolf Hitler:	A man who led Germany during the Second World War.
Air Raid:	When planes flew over towns or cities and dropped bombs during the war.
The Blitz:	A time during the Second World War when German planes dropped lots of bombs on British cities, especially at night.
Evacuation:	When children and some adults were sent from big cities to the countryside to keep them safe from bombs.
Home Front:	This is what life was like for people who stayed at home during the war. They worked hard to help win the war, even though they weren't fighting.
Royal Air Force (RAF):	The team of pilots and planes that protected Britain from enemy attacks during the war.
Conscription:	A rule that said some people had to join the army, navy, or air force to help fight in the war.
Luftwaffe:	The name of Germany's air force during the Second World War.
Turning Point:	A time when something big happens that changes how things are going, like when the Allies started winning the war.
Spitfire:	A fast and famous British plane used in the war to fight enemy planes.
Hurricane:	Another strong and important British plane that helped protect Britain during the war.
