Black people boycott the bus companies

Activist	A person who works hard to make things fairer or better for people by speaking out and helping others.
Boycott	When people stop using or buying something to show they want change or fairness.
Civil Rights	Basic freedoms and fairness everyone deserves, like being treated equally and respected no matter who they are.
Discrimination	Treating someone unfairly because of who they are, like their skin colour, religion, or where they're from.
Prejudice	Thinking bad things about someone without knowing them, just because of their looks or background.
Protest	When people gather to show they don't agree with something and want it to change.
Racial	Things that relate to someone's skin colour, culture, or where their family comes from.
Seamstress	A person who sews clothes or fabric items, often making beautiful or useful things with needles and thread.
Segregation	Keeping groups of people apart unfairly, like not letting some children go to the same school because of their skin colour.
Activist	A person who works hard to make things fairer or better for people by speaking out and helping others.
Black Lives Matter	A movement to show that Black people deserve fairness, respect, and safety, just like everyone else.
