Key Vocabulary

Continent	A very big piece of land. The world has 7 continents: Africa, Asia, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, Oceania.
hemisphere	Half of the Earth. The Earth can be split into top and bottom (northern and southern hemispheres).
rainforest	A thick forest in a hot, wet place with lots of plants and animals.
tropical	A hot and wet place, often near the equator, like a jungle.
Big five	Five famous wild animals in Africa: lion, leopard, elephant, rhino, and buffalo.
compass	A tool that shows direction – North, South, East, and West.
landmark	A special place that people know and visit, like the Eiffel Tower or Big Ben.
size	How big or small something is.
currency	The kind of money a country uses. In the UK, our currency is pounds (£).
population	How many people live in a place.
country	A part of the world with its own land, people, and rules. The UK is a country.
