

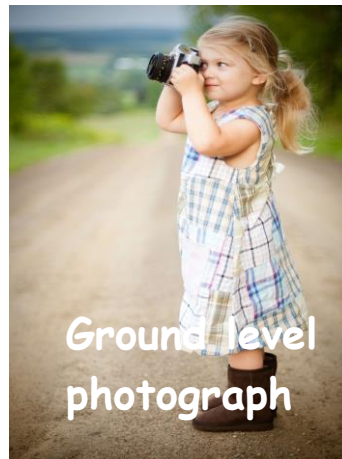


### New Knowledge:

## Key Vocabulary

<b>School</b>	A place people go to for their education.
<b>Address</b>	An address is the name of a place with a postcode and other information such as street and town names to help you locate where it is.
<b>Aerial photograph</b>	A picture of an object or place that has been taken from above.
<b>Fieldwork</b>	Investigating the outdoors using geographical tools and thinking, and gathering information or data, is known as fieldwork.
<b>Label</b>	A label is a word or phrase added to a map, a photograph or a diagram to identify a feature.
<b>Ground level photograph</b>	A ground level photograph is a picture of an object or place taken from the ground.
<b>Locational language</b>	Locational language describes the location or place of something in relation to something else. (eg next to, beside, above)
<b>Map</b>	A map is a two-dimensional representation of an area, showing geographical features and where they are in relation to each other.
<b>Route</b>	A route shows the starting point and end point of a journey, sometimes with stops in between.
<b>Weather</b>	The weather of a place is the day to day condition of the atmosphere, e.g. sunny, snowing, warm, etc.
<b>Seasons</b>	The seasons are four times of year that have different weather and they are spring, summer, autumn and winter.
<b>Fieldwork</b>	Investigating the outdoors using geographical tools and thinking, and gathering information or data is known as fieldwork.





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
